In 2014, ACH created the Our Community Our Kids (OCOK) division to pioneer an innovative, improved approach to foster care services in Texas. The improvements OCOK delivered in seven North Texas counties—including keeping abused and neglected children safe, quickly finding placements within their community and keeping siblings together more often—helped Texas adopt Community-Based Care (CBC) as state law in 2017. As the first in Texas to enter Stage II of CBC, in 2020 OCOK began taking on responsibility not just for the child, but their biological family as well.
