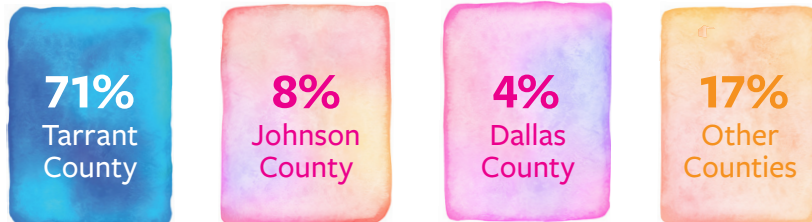

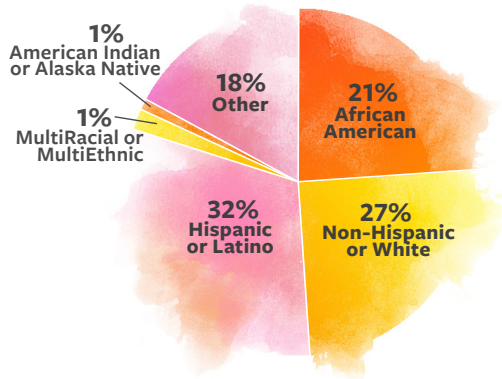

County of Origin

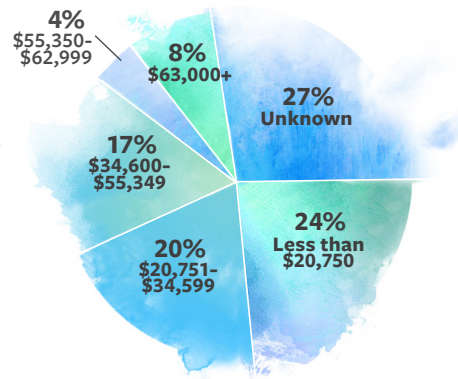

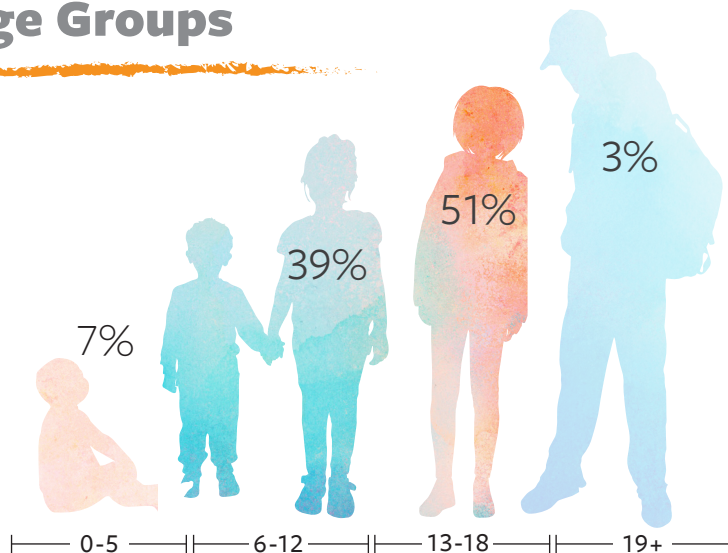
Race Ethnicity

In 2020, 1,930 unduplicated clients were enrolled in ACH programs and services.



ACH has been accredited every year since 2003 by the Council on Accreditation and in 2018 Our Community Our Kids became the only nationally accredited community-based care contractor in Texas. Our vision is for families to thrive and children to experience safety, hope and love.



In 2014, ACH created the *Our Community Our Kids* (OCOK) division to pioneer an innovative, improved approach to foster care services in Texas. The improvements OCOK delivered in seven North Texas counties—including keeping abused and neglected children safe, quickly finding placements within their community and keeping siblings together more often—helped Community-Based Care (CBC) become state law in 2017. OCOK continues to lead the way in 2020 as the first contractor in Texas to enter Stage II of CBC, taking on responsibility not just for the child, but their biological family as well.
