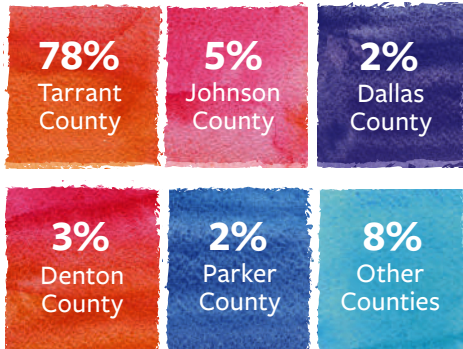

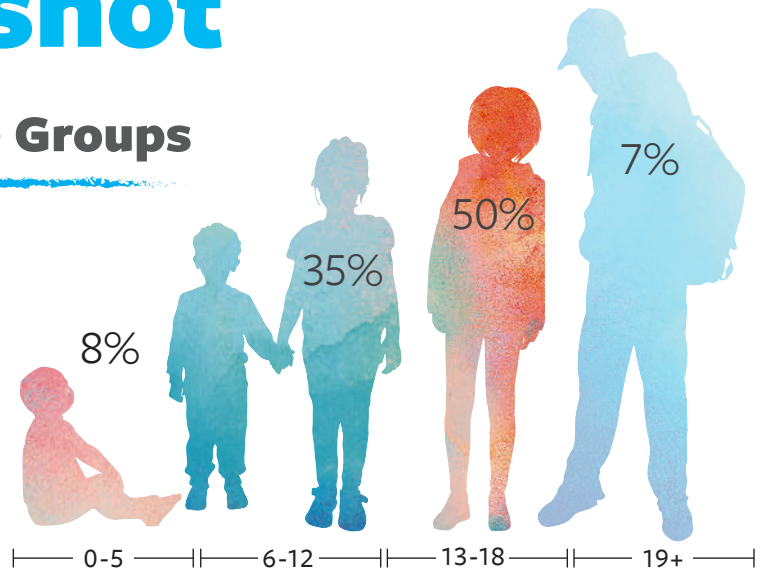

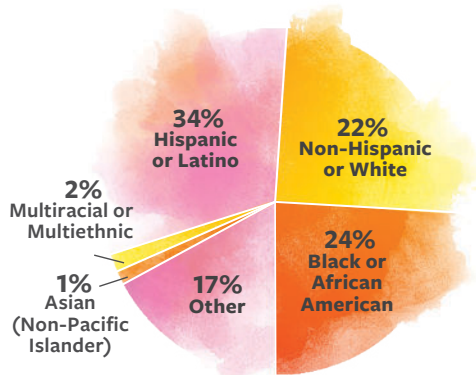
County of Origin



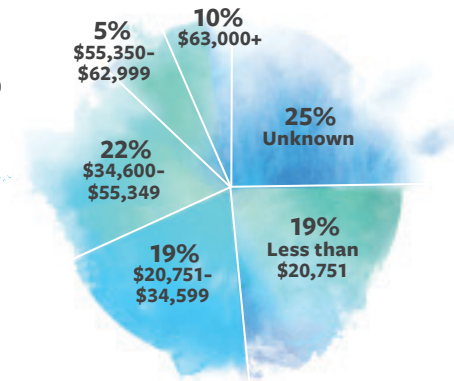
Age Groups
