Crisis Intervention

When a crisis strikes, every minute counts.

- Our 24/7 hotline is staffed by skilled, bilingual professionals who can determine the best course of action through ACH or through a referral to other community services. Last year, **Our Assessment, Intervention and Referral Services (AIRS)** team answered 7,087 calls.
- For youth feeling unsafe or threatened, help is as close as the nearest of more than 250 **Safe Place** sites, including all area QuikTrip locations. With one call, fast help will be coming from ACH.
- Our **Youth Emergency Shelter** offers 24/7 safety and care to youth ages 5-17 who are runaways, homeless or experiencing or at risk of sexual exploitation and/or trafficking. ACH works to quickly reunite them with their families or find alternative living arrangements.
- The **Turning Point** program is an innovative crisis stabilization and respite program delivered in a home-like setting for youth in foster care ages 10-17. Located at our Wedgwood Campus, Turning Point acts as a caring alternative to what can be more traumatizing hospitalizations.
- The **Secure Assessment Facility** serves youth in the child welfare or mental health systems who find themselves in a crisis or in a transition between placements. This program provides a safe and secure temporary setting for ages 5-17 who may have a history of complex trauma. Staff can quickly stabilize crisis situations and offer the assessment and treatment needed to secure longer term placement.

Foster Care and Adoption

Providing safe, caring and love-filled homes for children.

- When children can't live with their biological families due to abuse and neglect, ACH **Foster Care** services seek other caring adults who open their homes and hearts to children needing a safe, family environment. Foster families are responsible for housing, feeding, and transporting the children placed in their care.
- **Kinship Connections** is a voluntary program which offers support to families (or close family friends) who are caring for a relative's child(ren) who is in foster care. Delivers an array of services that may include support groups parent education, in-home services, referrals, concrete services, and assistance to licensure or adoption.
- The goal of our foster care program is reunification, but when that is not possible ACH **Adoption** services matches children with a caring, forever-family who has been educated about their needs and embraces them into their family with a lifelong commitment.
- Through **Intercept**®, a program of Youth Villages, ACH is helping to reunite foster children with their families. We serve ages 0-18 who have serious emotional and behavioral problems or have experienced trauma, including abuse and/or neglect. Intensive support, new parenting and communication skills, and evidence- and strengths-based mental health intervention services help families retain children in their custody.

Family Services

We are committed to always thinking family first.

- **Youth and Family Counseling and Skill-BUILDER Classes** deal with issues like anger management, bullying, reducing conflict and parenting wisely. Last year, these **Real Help for Real Life** programs provided 6,681 professional counseling sessions valued at \$1,500,000 — all free of charge.
- **Families Together** provides transitional housing for single mothers and their children who are experiencing homelessness due to domestic violence. At the same time, ACH helps them heal from their trauma and develop their independence.
- The **Kinship Navigator** program is for families outside the child welfare system who are caring for a relative's child(ren). The program offers outreach, education, and support for these families. Our staff will work to provide meaningful engagement, help, and connection to resources that may be needed, including food, clothing, and legal aid.

Residential Services

Providing a caring, stable and safe environment during healing.

- Our **Wedgwood Residential Campus** features several homes and a private park where kids can attend local schools while learning to deal with their trauma. It is home to our Turning Point and Transitional Living programs.
- The **Transitional Living Program** is for 14-17 year-olds who are unable to live with their families. This Wedgwood campus program assists youth with family reunification and also develops life skills to support their transition to independent living.
- Youth aging out of foster care often find they're not yet prepared to succeed in life. The **LIFE Project** (Learning Independence from Experience) is a supervised independent living program that provides young adults 18-21 the opportunity to live and learn in a more self-directed environment that inspires the confidence and self-sufficiency youth need to live on their own.
- An innovative **Residential Treatment Center** puts some of the most vulnerable youth in the foster care system on an accelerated path to success. When these teens understand they are in a safe place with adults who can be trusted, our goal is to help heal their trauma within a year. We can then connect them to a support system before eventually living successfully in a family.
